"AUDITION NOTICE NUNSENSE"

Dartmouth Players will be holding open auditions for the award-winning musical comedy "*Nunsense*," by Dan Goggin, and directed by Geoff Ball.

The musical is a "Show-within-a-show." Five lovably lively nuns decide to produce a benefit talent show in order to raise money to bury four nuns accidentally poisoned by the convent cook. Their characters, the music, the jokes, the bloopers and unexpected outcomes all add up to an evening of hilarity for everyone, regardless of religious beliefs.

Actors will be asked to read a piece of text (provided); sing a song they have prepared; and do some movement/dance steps (no preparation required).

Five females are needed. The age of four of the nuns is very flexible. The fifth should be able to appear young (early 20's if possible).

All must be able to portray very individual, very human, characters in fast-paced interaction with others. All roles are major, and ensemble acting is crucial.

All must be strong singers, capable of Broadway tunes, solo to quintet, with a bit of Gospel, Country, and Doo-Wop. All should be capable of very basic dance steps. The roles:

Mother Superior; controlling, but caring; feisty but with a weakness for the spotlight.

Mistress of Novices; dynamic, competes with Mother Superior; sings Gospel as well as Broadway
Sister Robert Anne; street-wise, but with a heart of conscientious gold.

Sister Mary Amnesia; sweet, innocent (lost memory) and enthusiastic, but with an undercurrent of devilry. Sings a "duet" with herself (ventriloquism optional); a bit of Country and a bit of Mozart coloratura. Should be able to semi-improv with audience.

Sister Mary Leo; The Novice. Should appear young. Wants to be the first ballerina nun. Should have some ballet ability, preferably in toe shoes.

Auditions will be Sunday, August 20, 1 to 4 pm; Monday, August 21, 7 to 10 pm; Dartmouth Players Theatre, 33 Crichton Ave., Dartmouth. "Nunsense" will run from November 8 to 25, with 14 performances.

People interested in back stage work should attend the auditions. Many are required, including ASM(s), Lighting, Sound, Props, Sets, etc.
