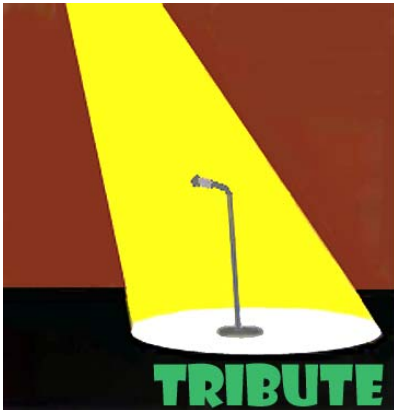

Join us for a Mid-Winter thespian feast bringing together seasoned DP actors, director and crew with talented newcomers to our stage. **Tribute**, with Tamara Perlmutter, Jim Lindsey, Ruth Flemming, Geoff Ball, Scott Maggio, Julie Ann Stodolny and Angela Snair will warm your heart and stir up reasons to pay **Tribute** to someone you love.

I've waited a long time to direct a production of **Tribute**. **Tribute** is terrific. One of those little gems of a play that make you so glad you were part of the experience. Written by Bernard Slade; it's original Broadway lead Jack Lemmon received a Tony Award nomination for his interpretation of Scottie Templeton. Mr. Lemmon recreated the role in the film version of the play, which also starred Robbie Benson as Jud, Lee Remick as Maggie and Colleen Dewhurst as Dr. Gladys Petrelli. So you see - some wonderful actors have already left their mark on this piece and I can't wait to see what we do with it.

A little bit about the play. Scottie Templeton is a failed writer who is now a second-rate press agent; full of laughs on the outside but terribly depressed and lonely on the inside. When he finds out he is terminally ill, Scottie realizes his lifetime of shortcomings and tries desperately to reconcile with his son, Jud. Can Jud love a father who practically abandoned him as a child and now wants to be forgiven? Scottie's first wife, Maggie, is caught up in the tension and conflict between father and son. **Tribute** is a sincere, touching and sensitive drama with irrepressible humour that creates a truly memorable evening in the theatre.

A little about the playwright.

Born in Toronto, Bernard Slade is one of Hollywood's most prolific writers. After writing shows for the CBC, he moved with his family to Los Angeles, where he began his career as a writer and story editor on *Bewitched*, (where he introduced the world to Aunt Clara). He has created eight television series: *Love On A Rooftop*, *The Flying Nun*, *The Partridge Family*, *Getting Together*, *Bridget Loves Bernie*, *Mr. Deeds Goes To Town*, *The Girl With Something Extra*, and *Good Heavens*. As a Broadway playwright, he made his debut writing *Same Time Next Year*, which has been presented in over 40 languages worldwide. Other plays include *Romantic Comedy*, *Special Occasions*, *Fatal Attraction*, *An Act of the Imagination*, *Return Engagements*, *Every Time I See You*, and a sequel to *Same Time Next Year*, titled *Same Time, Another Year*.

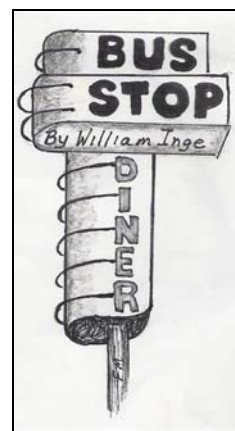
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AUDITION NOTICE

In the middle of a snowstorm, a bus from Kansas City stops at a roadside diner. Four weary travelers are going to have to stay until morning. Cherie, a nightclub chanteuse, has the most to worry about. She's been pursued, made love to and kidnapped by a young cowboy with a ranch of his own and the romantic methods of a headstrong bull. He is ready to sling her over his shoulder and carry her, screaming and kicking, all the way to Montana. Even as she's ducking out from under his clumsy but confident embraces, she pauses to muse, "Somehow deep inside of me I got a funny feeling I'm gonna end up in Montana."

As a counterpoint to the main romance, the proprietor of the cafe and the bus driver at last find time to develop a friendship of their own, a middle-age scholar comes to terms with himself, a young girl, who works in the cafe, gets her first taste of romance and the sheriff tries to "protect the innocent."

"BUS STOP is Mr. Inge's most popular play and his one out-and-out comedy!"

Director's Wrap-up



The musical comedy "Nunsense" was indeed a "smash hit," setting a new record for Dartmouth Players attendance, thanks to 1,925 playgoers.

The success, of course, did not appear magically, as much as it may have seemed to to the wildly enthusiastic audiences, but was the result of countless hours of hard work by a great many talented people. The marvelous cast rehearsed intensely and uncomplainingly for over 120 hours, on top of hours of outside preparation. Kudos to: Carole Ball, Shannon Kelly, Valerie Bellamy, Sharleen Kalayil and Kimberley Taylor, with supporting roles by Frances Taggart and Cy Giacomini. The arduous hours invested in acting, singing, and dancing, with musical direction by Cy and choreography by Shannon, certainly paid off in major dividends of laughter and applause.

A different, but equal, contribution to the success was the incredible amount of effort poured into the production by the "immediate crew", by which I mean those who worked at rehearsals and performances. The show could not have been such a success without so many "behind the scenes" workers. Thanks to, among others: Cliff and Valerie Tyner, Kevin Smee, G. Besides the incredible laughter and applause from so many happy audience members, "Nunsense" was noteworthy for many other reasons. Production deadlines were met on time or earlier; the Technical Rehearsal set an amazing record of 1½ hours, for a rehearsal that could have taken several hours. What was noticeably missing was that bane of amateur theatre, "Hell Week": the cast

and crew were so well prepared by the final week of rehearsals that I was able to give them the last 2 dress rehearsals off! The show "hit the ground running," a perfectly polished gem right from opening night!

Most impressive to me, as Director, were the spirit, camaraderie, and energy of the cast and crew. In over 42 years of theatre work, I have seldom, if ever, seen a cast and crew that worked so hard and so happily together. Thank you all for a wonderful experience of true "community" theatre!
