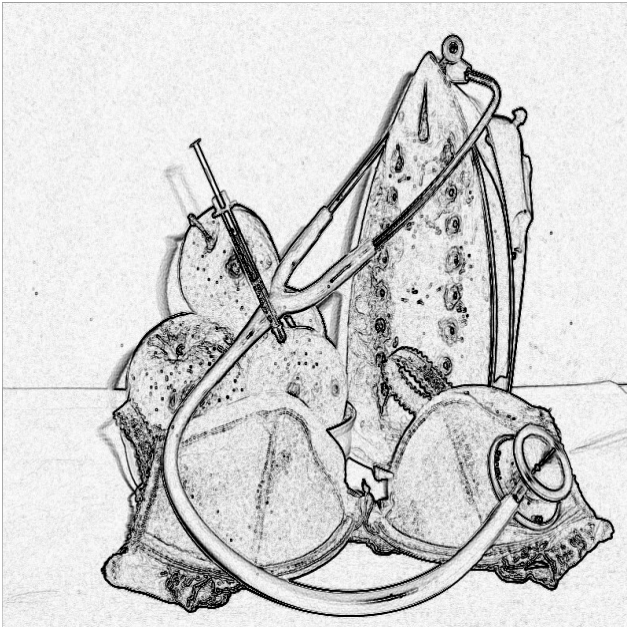

Audition Notice: **THE CLEAN HOUSE**



January 13 and 14, 2008

The Clean House, by Sarah Ruhl is a new (Lincoln Center premiere Oct. '06), very exciting play, a Pulitzer Prize Finalist, and an outstanding success on the professional circuit.

A husband and wife, both physicians, hire a maid to keep their highly structured lives clean and tidy. The maid, however, would rather invent the Perfect Joke than clean, so the wife's sister steps in. Then an enigmatic woman appears, turning the house and everyone's lives upside-down before resolving all. Comedy, drama, reality and fantasy are all blended beautifully. Mature subject matter.

All five roles are major and very challenging, since all the characters undergo fundamental emotional and intellectual changes. Tight ensemble playing is a must.

NOTE: About ages: these are **SUGGESTED AGES ONLY**. Actual ages are flexible; the final result will depend upon the appearances of those cast.

CHARLES: a doctor, middle-aged; a bit naïve, but not dumb or buffoonish; a modern romantic, although he doesn't realize it.

LANE: his wife, also a middle-aged doctor; apparently in total control of Life, but changes profoundly and surprisingly.

VIRGINIA: the wife's (older) sister; obsessive-compulsive, also undergoes a startling transformation.

MATILDE: the maid, younger (late 20's to 30's); bored with cleaning, interested only in finding the Perfect Joke, so she can resolve her tormented past.

ANA: the patient (preferably older than Charles and Lane); charismatic, alluring, mysterious.

For the roles of Matilde and Ana, ability to speak, at least phonetically, a foreign language, preferably Spanish and/or Portuguese, would be an asset, but **NOT** a requirement.

This is our SPRING production. The play will run April 2nd through 19th, 2008, 14 performances.

Auditions will be held at the Dartmouth Players Theatre, 33 Crichton Ave., Dartmouth, on

Sunday, January 13, 2008 from 1 to 4 pm and Monday, January 14, 2008 from 6:30 to 9:30 pm; if necessary, call-backs will be held Thursday, January 17th.

Materials will be provided for auditions. Rehearsals will begin immediately following casting.

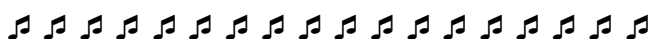
