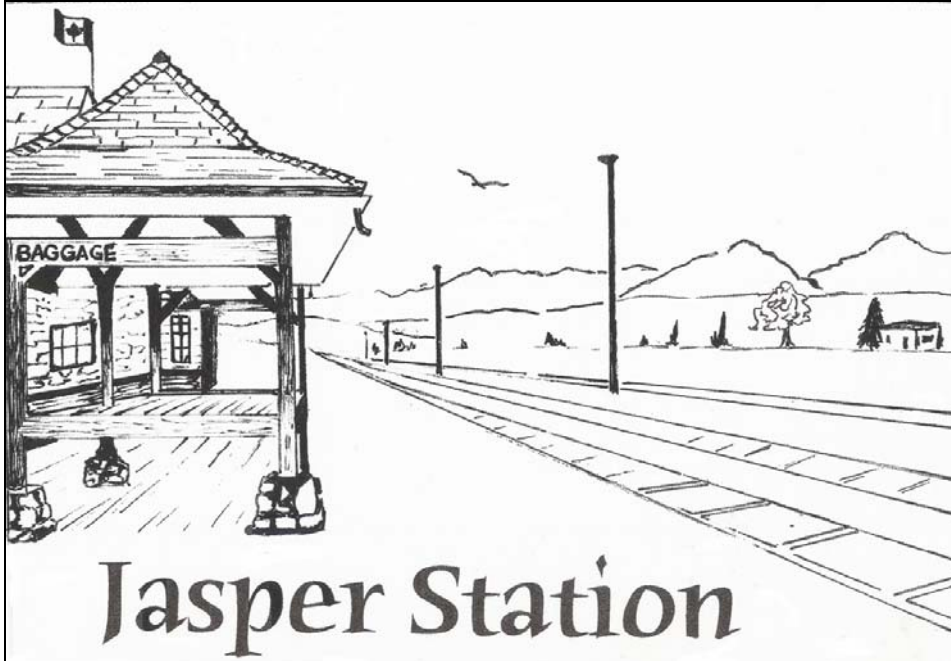

Dick Sircom and Holly Irving have given us a wonderfully workable and suitable set. Overseeing us all with his usual charm and complete competence is Angus Duncan who is a master at bringing together the people and pieces that are the mark of a successful production.

Jasper Station will delight and entertain you. It will also tug at your heartstrings, make you chuckle, evoke your sympathy and appeal to your reason – in short; it will make you feel good... about yourself, and the about the people around you. It's a slice of life.

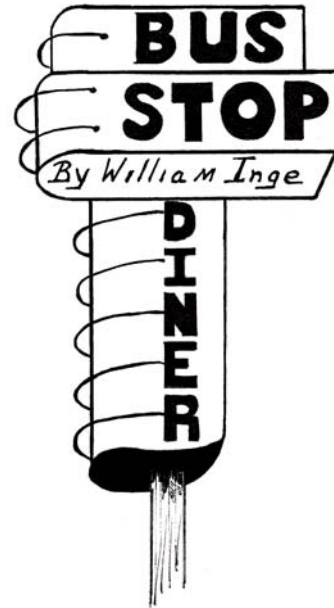

Nunsense returns this August!!!

Back by Very Popular Demand!

The musical comedy *Nunsense* by Dan Goggin will return to the Dartmouth Players (air-conditioned) stage this summer for nine performances only!

Response to the original *Nunsense* in November 2006 was tremendous. The entire run sold out within two days of opening night. The attendance – 1,925 – set an all-time record, by hundreds, for DP. A long waiting list developed.

Audience response was wildly enthusiastic, with long, loud and almost constant laughter and applause, and standing ovations at every performance. Kate Watson, theatre critic for *The Coast*, in her review of the area's performances for all of 2006, wrote: "Biggest bang for the buck: Dartmouth Players' production of *Nunsense* was good fun well done, and an amazing value at \$12 per ticket", \$10 Seniors and Students.

We have received a constant stream of requests to bring back the show. Because of these, and the people who were unable to get tickets in



November, that's exactly what we're doing: bringing back those wacky, singing, dancing nuns.

Directed again by Geoff Ball, *Nunsense* will run August 16, 17, 18; 22, 23, 24, 25 at 8 pm, with Sunday matinees August 19 and 26 at 2 pm.

Dartmouth Players is very fortunate to have the highly accomplished, award-winning musician Nhat Viet "Toto" Phi (www.phifamily.com) as pianist for the production.

As a cast member he was the ultimate team player. He was a perfectionist; he was always prepared, and you just knew that you could trust him to do the job, and do it well.

David has appeared in more shows than we can list here, but was last seen on the Dartmouth Players' stage in our production of Agatha Christie's, "Deathtrap" as the lawyer, Porter Milgrim.

David will also be remembered for his smile that was ever ready or a good joke he could not wait to share.

He loved to sing and play the guitar, and at many cast parties for shows that he was a part of, you could count on music as a part of the celebration.

David did not take friendship lightly. If David called you a friend, then you remained one for life. We've all lost a friend in David and we are all grateful to have been a part of his life's journey. David, we are really going to miss you...
